RESOLUTION NO. 16-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF JEANNETTE AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A SINGLE APPLICATION FOR ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR GRANT FUNDING PURSUANT TO THE EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM TO PURCHASE FINANCE, TAX AND ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE AS WELL AS CODE ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE ITEMS

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has established a program known as the Early Intervention Program, which is designed to offer a pre-emptive step for municipalities who feel that their financial situation may be adversely impacted by certain economic conditions within its municipality; and

WHEREAS, said Early Intervention Program is administered by the Governor's Center for Local Government Services, which is part of the Department of Community and Economic Development; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jeannette desires to submit a single application for assistance requesting two (2) grants under the Early Intervention Program, which will fund valuable finance, tax and accounting software as well as code enforcement assistance items; and

WHEREAS, grant funding for such software/services are/is available in the amount of One-Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) Dollars through the Early Intervention Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jeannette is willing to provide a local match in an amount up to Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars to be applied towards the costs of such.




RESOLUTION NO. 16-01
