- h. Discuss The 400 Clay Ave. proposal. For the meeting, Ms. Marcy Stein is discussing the historical significance of the PNC building as a historical site. She is in contact with the State Historical Planning Office (SHPO). They are the agency who manages the process of granting a building into the national registry. The submission can go two ways either as building by itself, OR through a process where the town has plans to create a historical district. The latter has a different set of submission criteria. The Planning Commission should discuss need to have a definitive process to move forward. Once the Determination of Eligibility is formally issued, SHPO will require a 30-day review process (which most likely will go through comments and edits until final). Upon the determination of Eligibility, another process begins for the submission onto the National Registry. There is a specific set of requirements and

application to be issued. Those applications are reviewed by the State of PA 3 times a year. And SHPO will require 60 days to formalize upon review ad comments. As of now, the review times are February, June, and October. October is tight and most likely submit Feb 2022. However, a positive response related to the Determination of Eligibility, can begin the tax credit process.
