Asked if the lot next to AB Ceramics could become a parking lot in the future.

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2. Jackie Homan- lives at 622 ½ Whiley Ave. She stated that there is an empty house across the street that she maintains and there is people that are dumping liter and other debris down the hillside and covering the garage that is behind it. There is also another house located next to her that has high grass and hasn't been cut this year. She provided photos for council to look at and asked if something could be done to solve these issues.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Ms. Langdon- Langdon discussed the three motions on the agenda. She discussed the planting and removing of the knot weed up at North end playground. She discussed how Brian Crooks will provide the chemicals and allow them to properly treat the knot weed. She discussed finding a grant to get someone licensed to buy the chemicals and help property owners get rid of the knot weed because this species is found all throughout the community. She discussed putting trees down along 4th street on the city lot and the School District lot. Also adding trees down in West Jeannette to provide some shade for where the kids are playing.

Mrs. Mozley- Gave the monthly Sanitation Dept. Report, Chief Frye gave the fire report. He stated there has been 99 calls since the last meeting, they have completed 144 hours of training since last month. He stated they held a demo hearing last month and only one parcel was given a year extension to repair their property. He stated they are aware of the issues on Wiley Ave and unfortunately it falls outside the ARP zones and will have to be City Demos in the future. Bill Whetzel gave the monthly Code Enforcement and property maintenance report.

Mr. Highlands-Highlands gave an update on the balance of the general fund and capital reserve fund. He stated that the audit is going to be starting and will be completed in a few months. He also stated that all businesses need to pay their business registration fee or they will be getting a citation

Mr. Krawtz- Gave the monthly Streets Dept. report.

Mr. Antoniak- Chief Johnston gave the monthly police report, he also gave an update on the K9 car and the purchase. He stated that they are behind on getting it outfitted due to backorder of supplies. Mayor Antoniak also gave the CDBG Report given from Urban Design Ventures. He addressed the parking down on 4th street and all the businesses that use to be on 4th street. He stated this problem has been going on for many years and we as the city are listening,

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Unfortunately it is a state road and the City is limited on what we can do to solve this issue. However we will look into the situation.

Councilwoman Mozley stated that she really loves the idea of planting the trees and getting the knot weed out of the parks. However, with the upgrades that are being done at the parks it makes



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her nervous to do this before the upgrades are complete. Although we have plans in place construction often changes and things made need to be adjusted at these parks.

Tim Witt explained why we were voting on the motion to table and not the original motion that was seconded.

Councilwoman Langdon stated these trees are not going to be In the way of the construction. She stated that these trees are not set in stone and the final place for them can be changed. Langdon stated there will be another planting in the spring, but the only problem is that we need to address the species that is attacking the city parks. Councilwoman Langdon expressed the need to find a grant to get someone trained and able to tackle the Knot Weed across the City. Mayor Antoniak asked if we can vote on the motion to table because there is additional information that needs to be discussed.

Mayor Antoniak stated he is not against planting trees; however, we need to find out who is going to water the trees, how much we will pay Antonacci, and that we need to address the species as well but it will all be costly. He stated he did not get the drawings until noon today and did not have time to review all the information that was provided. He also stated that we paid Butz half a million to remove trees at West Jeannette and we need to be smart in where we will place additional trees.
