CITIZENS:

Mike Deluzio: A Jeannette resident living on Arlington Avenue addressed Council on the North End Playground regarding the weeds that are growing and encroaching onto his property, and wanted an update on how the City intends to handle the problem. He further asked for police patrols for issues with young people at the playground.

Tina Deluzio: A Jeannette resident living on Arlington Avenue addressed Council regarding an incident, in which the police were called in response to banging on the back door and windows as harassment from youth around her home. Videos were taken of the incident.

Susan Pavis: Jeannette resident living on Arlington Avenue addressed Council on the North End Playground requesting a curfew sign, police patrols, and remediation of the weeds on the property.

Brandon Wilcox: A Jeannette resident living on Arlington Avenue thanked Council for allowing the Food Truck Thursday Events to occur, and further inquired as to the revisions to the proposed Curfew Ordinance.Sherry Wood: A Jeannette resident living in the Jeannette Manner informed Council of the improvements being made to the units in the building. She further indicated that women in the building are taking steps to arm themselves with pepper spray, as there were some security issues in the door to the alleyway, and she had names of vandals to give to the police.

Justin Vestrand: Representative of Exelos, the City's IT provider, addressed Council by indicating a distinct breakdown in communications between his company and the City.

Kathie Tanyer: A Jeannette resident living on Laura Street thanked everyone for the Jeannette Summerfest as a successful event.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Mr. Highlands: Gave the monthly finance report. Mr Highlands further indicated that 4 businesses that have not turned in the necessary paperwork to receive their \$5,000.00 for COVID assistance. Lowry Avenue sidewalk reconstruction, curbing, and paving for next year's schedule, as well as the 6th Street Bridge.

Mrs. Langdon: Encouraged people to submit items to be placed into the time capsule. No smoking signs for the Amphitheater.

Mr. Krawtz: Gave the monthly Streets Dept. report.

Mrs. Mozley: Addressed the issue on the North End Playground by indicating the tour of the City Parks for a recreation grant to cover the costs to remediate the weeds. Tim Witt addressed the changes to the proposed curfew ordinance: community service, fee reductions, and guidelines on detaining delinquents. Mrs. Mozley additionally gave the monthly sanitation report. Bill Frye gave the Fire Dept. monthly report and indicated that there will be a demolition hearing for multiple blighted properties in the City. Bill Whetzel gave the monthly Code Enforcement and Property Maintenance reports.



DEPARTMENT REPORTS: (Continued)

Mr. Antoniak: Chief Donald Johnston gave the monthly Police report. Thanked Ed Antonacci for his work on the flood projects in the City. The Mayor addressed paving requests as only so much can be done at a given time. The Mayor discussed the possibility of a merger between the Jeannette School District and the Hempfield Area School District citing US News statistics on the situations facing the children in these districts. A merger, according to the Mayor, would benefit the children with more activities and resources available for their needs, which should draw families into Jeannette. The state Dept. of Education no longer steps into merger situations, so a vote from the School Board would be required to begin the process.
