a. Group formed from Forward Cities initiative still meeting; there was talk about trying to create a space that would be a co-working area / entrepreneurship resource center. Two main areas talked about doing this at: the library or second story of city hall. There should be money available through NPP funds (Neighborhood Partnership Program; what paid for the amphitheater / other projects in town 5 or so years ago. This program is administered through Westmoreland Community Action and could be up to \$200k / year for 6 years if approved). WCA is working on that right now. If received, would need to put more thought into this entrepreneurship center and/or other projects in town we could do with this money. WCA is also working on installing 'Welcome Centers' throughout the county which is designed to be a resource center for people to be able to do things like look for jobs, housing, and generally provide any assistance that is available. It kind of goes hand in hand with this entrepreneurship resource center idea as it could be something all-in-one and staffed with NPP funds / WCA funds until a more sustainable funding source is secured OR the center collects enough money to be self-sustaining through fees collected by people renting out an office or a desk there. There are several models of these co-working spaces throughout the region.
