DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Mrs. Mozley: Gave the monthly Sanitation Department report. Fire Chief Bill Frye was absent from the meeting, so Ms. Mozley gave the monthly Fire Department report. Bill Whetzel gave the monthly Code Enforcement and Property Maintenance monthly reports. Bill Whetzel indicated that he had contacted Norfolk Rail Road Co., and they are currently busy handling the derailment issue in Palestine, Ohio.

Mr. Highlands: Gave the monthly Finance Department report. The IRS audit is completed, and the City is awaiting the final amount owed. Tax anticipation note (TAN) loans have not been necessary for multiple years now, which is a good indication of the City's financial condition. There is a \$50.00 Business Registration Fee that all commercial entities doing business in the City must pay.

Mrs. Langdon: Touched on the meeting with Brian Lawrence, the Westmoreland County Planning Dept. Director, and indicated that the City is a step ahead of the other municipalities for tackling blighted property issues. Ms. Langdon praised the efforts of Bill Frye, Bill Whetzel, and Tim Witt for all that they are doing in working with the County on the blight issues in the City. The City Garage to look into insulating the roof of their building to reduce the cost of heating, and the boiler in City Hall is being looked into as well.

Mr. Krawtz: Gave the monthly Streets Department report.

Mr. Antoniak: Chief Donald Johnston Jr. gave the monthly Police Department report. Ten (10) trees to be planted in the City through Tree PA, and the Police Department will be having a fundraiser to appoint a second K-9 Officer, Matt Painter.
